

Advent House Coronavirus Policy

Red Phase

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Introduction: Advent House (AH) has made several adaptive changes to the facility as well as its programming in order to protect its members and residents from the SARS-CoV2 pandemic. These adaptive changes, which are known as Advent House's Coronavirus Policy, have been outlined in three distinctive phases. These phases are "Red Phase," "Yellow Phase," and "Green Phase." Transition between each phase will take place after the AH Coronavirus Committee (AHCC) has met to discuss a transition. The AHCC consists of members from the AH Board of Directors, AH residents, AH student leaders, and AH Staff. The AHCC will only meet after the Knoxville County Health Department changes its 14 day trend line for daily new covid-19 cases or upon the request of the AH Board of Directors. Changes in the 14 day trend line will be considered when it transitions from a state of inclined, neutral, or negative growth. Any changes in the AH Coronavirus Policy Phases or in the Policy will be updated on the AH website (adventhouse.org) and disseminated to our residents *via* email and notified by physical mail. A paper copy will be provided upon request of a resident. A copy of AH's active phase will be posted by each entrance to the house with a poster containing a summary (see Figure 1).

Below is the Advent House Coronavirus Policy: **Red Phase**

Integrative Technologies:

Thermometers - Advent House will have a no-touch thermometer at the house. The wall mounted thermometer will be by the front door inside the foyer. A sign will be posted by the thermometer with step by step instructions detailing what to do if a fever is detected (See Figure 2).

Sinks – Each sink will be equipped with a "SinkBlink20" timer which will automatically count for 20 sec upon the faucet being turned on (Huber, 2020). More information can be found on their website at sinkblink20.com. Hand washing instructions will be posted by all sinks (see Figure 3) in addition to the displayed SinkBlink20 signs (see Figure 4).

Masks – ACF cloth masks will be provided to all AH Residents. Disposable masks will be located near the front entrance for any guest that will be entering the premise.

Resident & Guest Requirements:

Advent House will be open to residents and essential personal only. Guests, including family member of residents, will not be allowed inside the main house at this time. Essential personnel include, but are not limited to, construction workers, repairmen, and medical staff.

Apartments A and B will be permitted to have guests over, due to that fact that each apartment is isolated from the main house and have separate HVAC systems. Guests visiting the apartments must wear masks at all times along with residents of the apartment for the duration of the visit. In the event that someone in the main house has contracted Covid-19, apartment residents will only be allowed to have guests over their apartment if they quarantine from the main house for the duration of the ill residents quarantine period. If an apartment residents wishes to enter the main house during the quarantining period of an ill resident, the apartment resident must extend the quarantine to their apartment as well. Meaning no guests will be permitted in their apartment until the quarantine of the ill resident has ended.

Entry to the main house will only take place through the front door essential personnel. Residents may use the front or back door for entry. Upon entering the main house, the residents and essential personnel will be required to take their temperature on the hands-free no-touch wall thermometer located in the foyer. If a fever is detected then an alarm will sound, after which residents and essential personnel will follow the instruction outlined on the signage next to the thermometer (See Figure 2). It is worth noting that a non-resident with fever will not be permitted to enter the facility.

Masks must be worn inside the public areas of the main house at all time, even when one is alone in the house. Apartments A and B will be required to have masks worn at all times during the visit of an essential personnel or another Advent House resident other than the apartment occupant.

Upon entering the house, residents and essential personnel will be required to wash hands at the kitchen or first floor bathroom sinks. These sinks are equipped with SinkBlink20 technology and will have instructions posted by them (see Figure 3), (see Figure 4).

Event Changes:

No in-person AH or Adventist Christian Fellowship (ACF) events/activities will take place at the AH facility during this phase. Bible studies as well as other events will take place online *via* Zoom or other virtual platforms.

Guidelines for events outside of the AH facility:

We recommend that all AH students and residents follow CDC ([CDC, 2020a](#)) and KCHD ([KCHD 2020a](#)) guidelines when attending other events both indoors and outside.

In the event that a resident is sick with COVID-19:

Advent House will comply with all CDC recommendations on “If a resident in your facility has COVID-19 (suspected or confirmed)” ([CDC, 2020b](#)). The following is a summary of the CDC guidelines written in the context of our facility. More information can be found on their website ([CDC, 2020b](#)).

Residents are not required by law to notify AH staff if they think they may or have a confirmed case of COVID-19. In the event that a resident does choose to disclose to AH staff that they have been tested and confirmed positive for COVID-19 or that they suspect they have COVID-19, AH staff will work with KCHD to notify everyone in the house who may have been exposed (had close contact with the sick person) while maintaining the confidentiality of the sick person as required by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and, if applicable, the

Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) ([CDC, 2020b](#)).

The resident that has become ill will be provided with information on [how to care for themselves](#) and [when to seek medical attention](#) ([CDC, 2020b](#)). AH staff will also help the ill resident to the extent possible to get medical and spiritual assistance needed during the period.

Residents with [COVID-19 symptoms](#) and those in close contacts with them will be encouraged to self-isolate and limit their use of shared spaces as much as possible ([CDC, 2020b](#)). The Bathroom upstairs will be reserved for those that are ill from COVID-19 while the bathroom in the basement and first floor will be reserved for other residents ([CDC, 2020b](#)).


AH staff will provide transportation for any resident (suspected of having or having a confirmed case COVID-19) in need of transportation for testing or non-urgent medical care ([CDC, 2020b](#)).

The protective measures in response to a resident contracting the Coronavirus at Advent House will end after the ill resident has had 10 days symptom-free or at a later date per the recommendations of the CDC ([CDC, 2020c](#)), KCHD ([KCHD, 2020a](#)), or the individual's healthcare provider.
